The 7th MUSA HELLENICA Festival Atmosphères 2023 in Chios invites us to discover how MUSIC shapes our own "atmospheres"

Nine days of intertwined events organized in themes: Music of our Time, Tradition and Locale, Education and Workshops for all ages, thus supporting young creators, musicians, and researchers of Greek civilization and music.

2023 is the 100th birthday of Hungarian composer György Ligeti, a central figure in the 2nd half of the 20th century. Ligeti pursued an experimental composition style, creating his own distinct body of works. His iconic work, *Atmosphères*, was brought to the big screen in Stanley Kubrick's *2001: A Space Odyssey*. During the festival, we will have the opportunity to listen to the works of György Ligeti alongside the works of other Hungarian composers such as Franz Liszt, Ferenc Farkas and Béla Bartók.

For three days the town of Kallimasia will host an Arts Fest with dozens of diverse and concurrent happenings: the schoolyard, the town square, the Monastery of Plakidiotissa, the yards and alleyways will fill with events for young and old. The streets will come alive with practitioners of traditional professions, who will bring to life artifacts borrowed from the exhibits of the Folk Museum. Children will perform in a new play adapted from a story by Yiannis Kalliaros. The Workshop of Byzantine Music will chant hymns old and new in the Monastery.

On the beach of Lagada, during the *Full Buck Moon*, Øaretra Crystalina will invite us to sing along to favorite songs from Greece and beyond. This year the Festival collaborates with the Festival of P.E.K.E.V. and the Festival of Psara to present performances in Chios, Vrondathos, Kampos, Kallimasia, Lagada, and Psara.

The International Forum will invite a host of musicians and artists and give our residents, regardless of their age, the opportunity to experience their own "Atmospheres", to meet prominent artists and teachers of our time, collaborate and work with them in diverse workshops and projects, designed to reach all ages, levels and interests. In the 7th MUSA HELLENICA Festival, we are not just spectators, but co-creators. The 7th Festival is our FESTIVAL.

<u>Music Of Our Time</u> <u>Series</u>

The series *Music of Our Time* includes 3 concerts, 6 lectures on the work of György Ligeti, Greek, Latvian and Mexican composers, an Art Show and Workshop, and an International Forum of six young composers invited to compose new works for the festival.

2023 marks the 100th anniversary of György Ligeti's birth, one of the most important composers in the latter half of the 20th century. Influenced in his youth by the music of Bella Bartók, Ligeti developed a distinguished personal style, which he named "micropolyphony".

Ligeti's work reached a wide audience through Stanley Kubrik's film 2001: A Space Odyssey (1968), where music from his compositions Atmosphères, Requiem, Lux Aeterna, and Aventures was included in the film's score among works by other composers.

The first concert is for small forces centered around winds and strings. The second is dedicated to Ligeti's diverse piano works: pianist Konstantinos Destounis will coach young pianists on Ligeti's *Musica Ricercata* and works for 4 hands, while he will perform works by Liszt and Bartók, placing Ligeti in a historical perspective.

The last concert features composers from various countries and is centered around one of Ligeti's greatest works: *Kammerkonzert* for 13 instrumentalists.

To honor Ligeti's contributions to 20th century music, the title of the festival as well as the titles of the three concerts below are borrowed from his work *Atmosphères* for large orchestra.

His music reached wide audience through the 1968 Stanley Kubrick film 2001: A Space Odyssey, where sections from his works *Atmosphères, Requiem, Lux Aeterna* and *Aventures* are featured.
